Assessing Separate Households

In cases where the applicant is residing in the home of other adults, they may be considered a separate household and income from the other adults would not be required for determining eligibility.

| Questions to Ask To Determine Separate Household | Household Size |

| Does the household provide food, clothing, shelter, etc. with no expectation of payment or in-kind benefits? | If No - count as a separate household |
| Does the applicant pay the household for living in their home? | If Yes - count as a separate household. |
| Does the applicant exchange work, (e.g. household chores, babysitting) for the ability to live in the home? | If Yes - count as a separate household |
| Does the applicant share income and expenses with other people in the household? | If No - count as a separate household |
| Can the applicant provide current eligibility of SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, or W-2? | If Yes - count as a separate household |
| Can the applicant verify their status as an emancipated minor (reported or as determined by the Court)? | If Yes - count as a separate household |
