
Using Advanced Search in WIC MIS


Advanced Search might be useful for:

- Caseload Management: Following up with active participants without benefits.
- Breastfeeding follow-up: 9-month calls and 2 contacts the first week after birth.
 - o Refer to NPS Breastfeeding and NPS Documenting Notes in WIC MIS
- Targeted quality assurance or outreach: Chart review for documenting WIC notes; outreach to targeted participant categories.
- Note: An alphabetical list of participants can be printed by selecting **Print List** (1) located at the bottom left of the search screen. Data will not print the way it is "sorted". Recommend printing a screenshot for sorted data.




1. Search specific participant categories:

a. In this example, we searched for all active pregnant women by selecting the desired local agency / clinic name (1), appropriate category (2), active only (3), and return maximum (4) for the search criteria.




- 2. Select a column to sort:
 - a. <u>Caseload Management</u>: in the example below, we sorted by **BVT Date** (1) to determine who is active without benefits. This search was conducted 9/2/20 and shows participants with BVT dates prior to the search date.



 Staff can also run the Clinic Appointment List report for a specific time frame to view specific appointment types, determine next appointment, and BVT dates for selected categories.



- b. <u>Prenatal follow-up</u>: In the example below, we sorted by **Cert End** (1) date to determine prenatal participants close to delivery:
 - i. Note: the Cert End date for prenatal participants is EDD + 6 weeks minus 1 day.
 - 1. It will be helpful for staff to forecast 8-10 weeks from the search date to determine which participants are close to delivery.
 - a. In the example below, the search was ran 9/9/20. Participants with a Cert End date in November are likely due to deliver sometime in September.



- c. <u>Breastfeeding follow-up</u>: Sort by **Birth Date** (1) to determine breastfeeding participants that may need follow-up contacts:
 - i. In the example below, we sorted by the most recent birth date for exclusively breastfed infants.
